Life Group Questions

GETTING STARTED

1. Describe which portion of the Sunday message you learned something that you didn't previously know.
2. Discuss your prior understanding of Leviticus before this past Sunday. What surprised you? What stood out to you?
3. Are there parts of the Leviticus that still don't make sense to you? Discuss.

DIGGING DEEPER

1. Why do you think God required a sacrifice in order to forgive sin?
2. There are 5 different types of offerings listed in Leviticus chapters 1-5. Identify and discuss each one (hint: they are listed in this week's sermon notes)
 - What is different and unique about each of them?
 - What do they have in common?
3. Are “offerings” still relevant today? If so, what types of “offerings” does the Bible talk about?
4. What was the primary role of a priest in Leviticus?
5. Read Leviticus chapter 10:1-2. Why were Aaron's two sons killed?
6. When offering a sacrifice for sin, God made it clear that the offering needed to be “without spot or blemish” (1:3, 10; 3:1,6; 4:3) Why do you think God required this?
7. Read Hebrews 10:1-12.
8. What do these verses say about the “old system” of sacrifice?
9. Jesus was both the priest and the sacrifice. Why was this so important? How does it change things for us?

APPLYING THE MESSAGE

1. Read Leviticus 18:1-5. Why did God want the Israelites to be different? Do you believe these verses apply to us today? If so, how?
2. Do you see yourself as holy? Why or why not?

3. Read Leviticus 19:1-2. What does it mean to “be holy?”
4. 4. The book of Leviticus is all about getting close to God and staying close to God. What are some things you can do in order to get and stay close to God?
