LIFE GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

GETTING STARTED

1. Describe an environment you've been in that made it difficult for you to live out your faith.
2. What are some things that helped you stay strong spiritually?

DIGGING DEEPER

1. Who is Titus? (Someone read 2 Cor 8:23 & Gal 2:2-5). What do these passages tell us about Titus?
2. According to Titus 1:5, why did Paul leave Titus on the island of Crete?
3. How does Paul describe the characteristics of the leaders that Titus is to appoint (see 1:6-9)?
4. According to Titus 1:10-16, what are some of the issues that Paul is addressing?
5. Read Titus 2:1 and 2:7-8. Discuss why it's important to "practice what we preach"?
6. In Titus 2:2-6, Paul lists several traits of a growing Christian. Identify those traits and discuss.
7. Titus 3:1-2 – Paul urges believers to be submissive to authorities and show kindness to others. Why is this particularly important in a world that often promotes rebellion or self-centeredness?

8. Titus 3:3-7 – Reflect on the message of salvation in these verses. What does it teach us about God's kindness and mercy? How should this truth shape the way we view others, particularly those who may not yet know Christ?
9. Judaizers were a group of Jews who taught that in order to truly be saved, one must accept Jesus but also, conform to all of the Jewish laws, rituals, and festivals. Read the following verses and discuss Paul's plan of action for dealing with these false teachers.
