## "Undeserveable"

The Unsettling Truth For Just About Everything, Part 1 April 11<sup>th</sup>, 2021

"People almost invariably arrive at their beliefs not on the basis of proof, but on the basis of what they find attractive." Blaise Pascal, L'Art de persuader

In other words, when something is <u>ATTRACTIVE</u> to us, we go looking for reasons to <u>SUBSTANTIATE</u> our

belief

Jesus was <u>ATTRACTIVE</u>; people were <u>ATTRACTED</u> to Jesus; <u>EARLY</u> Christianity was attractive

The thing that made early Christianity so attractive is a single word: **GRACE** 

Grace is what we craze most when our guilt is **EXPOSED** 

Grace is what we're hesitant to **EXTEND** when confronted with the guilt of **OTHERS** 

Grace is really the **UNSETTLING SOLUTION** for just about everything

Definition: Grace is **UNDESERVED**, **UNEARNED**, **UNEARNABLE** favor

We can't recognize or receive for what it is until we're **CONVINCED** we don't **DESERVE** it

Grace can only be experienced in the context of a **RELATIONSHIP** where there is an **IMBALANCE**, and you

are on the **NEGATIVE** side of the ledger because of your **BEHAVIOR** 

This is why GOD had to SHOW up

We would have never known the **GRACE** of God without the **PRESENCE** of God

<u>John 1:14</u> (NIV) "The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth."

Jesus was **ALL** grace and **ALL** truth **ALL** the time

John concludes God is love because Jesus was **LOVE** in a **BODY** 

**LOVE** is all grace and all truth all the time

<u>Matthew 9:9</u> (NLT) "As Jesus was walking along, He saw a man named Matthew sitting at his tax collector's booth. 'Follow Me and be My disciple,' Jesus said to him. So Matthew got up and followed Him."

Matthew 9:11 (NIV) "When the Pharisees saw this, they asked His disciples, 'Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?"

<u>Matthew 9:12</u> (NLT) "When Jesus heard this, He said, 'Healthy people don't need a doctor—sick people do.'" <u>Matthew 9:13</u> (NIV) "But go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."

<u>John 8:10-11</u> (NIV) "<sup>10</sup> Jesus straightened up and asked her, 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' <sup>11</sup> 'No one, sir,' she said. 'Then neither do I condemn you,' Jesus declared. 'Go now and leave your life of sin.'"

It's **GRACE** and **TRUTH**. Jesus says, "You are **GUILTY**, but I don't **CONDEMN** you."

Jesus engaged people who had <u>NOT</u> acknowledged their sin and <u>INITIATED</u> a relationship and said, "FOLLOW Me."

<u>Luke 23:39-41</u> (NIV) "<sup>39</sup> One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at Him: 'Aren't you the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' <sup>40</sup> But the other criminal rebuked him. 'Don't you fear God,' he said, 'since you are under the same sentence? <sup>41</sup> We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong."

The criminal who rebuked the one insulting Jesus knew if Kingdom of Heaven is reserved for good, righteous, people who get it right every time, he had no <a href="HOPE">HOPE</a> and no <a href="CHANCE">CHANCE</a>
<a href="Luke 23:42">Luke 23:42</a> (NIV) "Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom."
<a href="Luke 23:43">Luke 23:43</a> (NIV) "Jesus answered him, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with Me in paradise."

Why? Because like life, grace is not **FAIR** – it better than fair, it's unsettlingly better than fair

Jesus knew that God's justice would **CRUSH** us

Romans 3:23 (NLT) "For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard."

Every sin has a GOTCHA; Jesus came to GETCHA

<u>Luke 16:16</u> (NLT) [Jesus said] "Until John the Baptist, the law of Moses and the messages of the prophets were your guides. But now the Good News of the Kingdom of God is preached, and everyone is eager to get in."

The "Good News" is embodied in a person, <u>JESUS</u>; the "Good News" can be summarized in a word, **GRACE**
